

Guidelines for Authors

- Manuscripts submitted for publication must meet the usual scholarly standards and requirements. Particular attention is paid to logical consistency and clarity of reasoning, and to the use of literature and other documents supporting arguments or hypotheses.
- Manuscripts must be submitted in electronic form in a common text format (*no* pdf files!).
- The manuscript must include an abstract describing as precisely and shortly as possible the content of the article (e.g., questions, methods, results, conclusions). It also must include some keywords.
- Tables and figures must be attached on separate sheets and numbered consecutively. They must be made available in reproducible, good printing quality. For each illustration or table, inscriptions, explanations and, if applicable, source references must be attached on a separate sheet.
- Footnotes are allowed but should be used sparingly.
- Literature references follow the APA (7th edition) style. References must be made in the main text in author-date format. The DOIs of the references must be added if they have one. - The authors grant the *Journal of Anomalistics* / *Zeitschrift für Anomalistik* a simple, non-exclusive, worldwide, and perpetual right to publish it under the Creative Commons License Attribution-Non-commercial 4.0 (CC BY-NC, <https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc/4.0/>). However, when an article has been submitted to the *JAnom* / *ZfA* for consideration, the Journal holds first serial (periodical) publication rights. Additionally, the publishers have the right to post the article on the Internet and to make it available via electronic as well as print subscription.
- By submitting an article, the author affirms that they hold all necessary copyrights and usage rights to the submitted work and that its publication does not violate any rights of third parties. If the article contains previously published third-party content (e.g., figures, tables, or text excerpts), the author confirms that all necessary permissions for use and publication have been obtained. The authors indemnify the editors and the publisher against any claims by third-parties that arising from copyright or usage rights violations related to the publication of the article.
- All submitted manuscripts are subject to an double-blind peer-review process. Manuscripts that are acceptable in principle but do not quite meet the required standards will either be returned for revisions, and/or edited to be published following the author's approval of edits.
- In order to promote scholarly discussion, in addition to anonymous peer review the editors will usually invite critical comments on a manuscript accepted for publication from other experts. Authors should assume that such commentaries will be published together with their article, and will have the opportunity for author responses.
